Private industrial and commercial individuals who have committed illegal acts must **confess or report all of their unlawful activities**.

Special attention should be given to **launching this struggle vigorously** in major cities such as **Tianjin, Qingdao, Shanghai, Nanjing, Guangzhou, Wuhan, Chongqing, Shenyang**, and the provincial capitals across the country.

This is to **mount a resolute counterattack** against the bourgeoisie's **rampant offensive against our Party over the past three years** on this issue—an offensive **more dangerous and serious than war itself**—and to **deal a major blow** to them. The goal is to **basically complete this task within two to three months**.

Party committees at all levels are requested to **meticulously plan and deploy** for this matter, and to **treat this as a large-scale class struggle**.

This deployment should be carried out **both internally** (within government agencies, schools, military units, and state-owned enterprises) and **externally** (in the private industrial and commercial sectors), with **close coordination between leadership bodies and the judiciary**. Newspapers and radio stations should engage in **strong propaganda efforts**, and **confidential internal bulletins** should be organized to circulate sensitive information.

In major cities, **internal publications** may be issued specifically for this campaign.

During this struggle, **appropriate consideration should be given to democratic parties and democratic figures from various sectors**, and attention must be paid to **organizing a united front for the "Three-Anti" campaign**.
