

## **Regulations of the Hunan Provincial Committee of the Communist Party of China on the "Five Antis" in Cities**

February 27, 1952

In accordance with the spirit of the Central Committee's instructions on the 23rd, the Provincial Party Committee has made the following provisions regarding the "five anti" issues in cities:

I. All county towns, including those where the prefectural government is located, will not be carrying out the "Five Antis" campaign at present. Whether or not to carry it out in the future will be decided after notification from the central government.

II. In all special municipalities, those that have not yet launched the "Five-Anti" campaign shall not launch a mass "Five-Anti" campaign. Those that have already launched the campaign shall gradually scale back the campaign, reducing arrests and confiscations. Confiscations shall be subject to approval by the Provincial Party Committee. Individual capitalists who have committed serious crimes and severely harmed the national economy shall be dealt with individually through administrative measures, without being subjected to large-scale mass campaigns.

III. Before receiving instructions from the Central South Bureau, the movement in Hengyang City should also be scaled back, focusing on a very small number of capitalists who constitute less than 1% of the population and have committed numerous crimes and have extremely poor interpersonal relationships; and arrests and confiscations should be stopped immediately, and those who must be arrested and confiscated should be reported to the Provincial Party Committee for approval.
