

The Central Committee of the Communist Party of China forwarded the Tianjin Municipal Committee's summary report on the anti-bureaucracy struggle and related documents from the North China Bureau.

(January 24, 1953)

To all departments of the Central Committee and the Military Commission, all Party groups of the Central People's Government; all Central Bureaus and Sub-Bureaus, all Military Regions, and to all provincial, municipal, and district Party committees, local Party committees, and Party groups of corresponding government departments: The Tianjin Municipal Committee's summary report on the anti-bureaucracy struggle dated January 16, and the North China Bureau's report on various problems exposed in Tianjin during the anti-bureaucracy movement dated January 9, are hereby forwarded to you for your reference. Tianjin City continued its anti-bureaucracy struggle on the basis of the "Three Antis" (anti-bureaucracy, anti-commandism, and anti-illegality) campaign, further exposing many serious errors in its work and proposing corrective steps and methods, achieving great results.

Party committees at all levels must earnestly follow the Central Committee's instructions of January 5, and in 1953, in conjunction with Party building and other work, starting with handling letters from the people, earnestly carry out the struggle against bureaucracy, commandism, and illegal and disorderly conduct. Specific plans and methods must be formulated according to the different circumstances in various regions to ensure victory in this struggle, and the implementation progress must be reported regularly. These two documents may be published in Party publications.
