

The Central Committee of the Chinese Communist Party Forwards the Report by the Party Group of the All-China Federation of Trade Unions on How to Consolidate the Victory of the 'Five-Anti' Campaign

(April 1, 1952)

To the Party Group of the All-China Federation of Trade Unions and all Central Bureaus and Sub-Bureaus:

The Central Committee forwards the report by the Party Group of the All-China Federation of Trade Unions dated March 22, titled "*On How to Consolidate the Victory of the 'Five-Anti' Campaign,*" for your reference, further study, implementation as appropriate, and to solicit your opinions.

The suggestion to retain the existing Urban Frugality Inspection Committees after the "Five-Anti" movement is necessary. However, it is not required to rename them as "Industry and Commerce Inspection Committees." Please study the specifics of the organization and tasks of these committees in the post-"Five-Anti" period.

On the matter of worker supervision of production in private enterprises, the Central Committee has already issued instructions. Currently, only supervision of production and business operations is to be promoted—not participation in management. Where the capitalist agrees, workers may in practice participate in management, but not in name. In name, it should remain as supervision rather than management. Furthermore, such measures must only be widely implemented after successful pilot trials and central approval. Blind implementation across localities must be avoided.
