The meeting approved the "Decision of the Central People's Government Administration Council on the Uniform Measures for the Conclusion of Treaties, Agreements, Protocols, Contracts, etc. with Foreign Countries",

the "Cultural Cooperation Association of the People's Republic of China and the Czechoslovak Republic"

"Resolution on Adjustment of Central People's Government Institutions" and "Resolution on Adjustment of Local People's Government Institutions."

Establishment of the Ministry of Grain resolved to merge the China Grain Company under the Ministry of Trade of the Central People's Government and the General Administration of Grain under the Ministry of Finance of the Central People's Government to form the Ministry of Grain of the Central People's Government, which would unify the management of grain procurement, processing, storage, transportation, and sales. By the end of 1952, the total number of cadres and staff in grain departments nationwide was 219,900, of which 65,900 were administrative staff, accounting for 30.0%; and 154,000 were employed in enterprises, accounting for 70.0%.
